Shortly after its presentation at SAF, in 2014, the printed edition was sold out and since then many people have wanted to acquire a copy.

Based on a wealth of documentation, hitherto virtually unpublished, from the London delegation of the Basque Government, as well as other archival and newspaper sources and numerous oral testimonies of direct protagonists, the historian Gregorio Arrien wrote a complete and voluminous work (902 pages), which addresses everything related to the exile of Basque children in the United Kingdom.

Save the Children! tells the story of the war in Euskadi, the evacuation and life in the different camps and boarding schools, but it also tells the story of their accompanying auxiliaries, teachers and priests, as well as the story of the London delegation and the rest of the Basque exiles who arrived in Great Britain. There is a great deal of new information in this work, and the reader will find a large number of details on what was already known, which painstakingly portray the passage of the Basques through the United Kingdom fleeing from the war. A reference work for scholars of the story of Basque exile in Great Britain and for the historical memory of the Basques who found refuge in the United Kingdom.
